In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the voters of Hartford, in said County, qualified to vote in Town affairs to meet at the Hartford Town Hall on the 10th day of March, 2025 (snow date March 11, 2025) at 6:30pm to act on Articles 1 and 2.

Article 1: To elect a Moderator to preside at said Meeting.

**Article 2: To see if the Town will vote to change the position of Road Commissioner from an elected position to an appointed position with a term of two years.
Recommended by the Board of Selectmen**

Notes: this part time position would now include new responsibilities as:

- Work with road software package.**
- Create a short term and long term road plan.**
- Create online bid specifications for new projects going out to bid.**
- Track, document, and report storm damage in the format that FEMA and MEMA require.**
- Work directly with road contracted companies to ensure timely and on budget road work.**
- Work with the Town Road Committee to develop priority projects that following the Hartford Road Plan.**
- Work with the Selectboard to secure road grants.**
- Reports to the Selectboard**

Select board News– Winter 2025

Another year has passed us by, and we hope this New Year has found everyone safe & healthy. It has been a busy year for everyone, including the Select board and all the volunteers on our boards and committees.

The Town Hall has been a busy place over the last several months. Our ATV club, Bear Mountain Riders, hosted a soldout Youth ATV Safety course and our Recreation Committee hosted a successful Hunter Safety Program and Hunter Breakfast.

In December, the Rec Committee partnered with Connie Hoellerman to bring the Joy to the Children event. This event brought free toys, books and games to parents/caregivers in Hartford, Sumner and Buckfield. Dozens of local families were able to get Christmas presents for their families at no cost. A wonderful thing in this challenging economy.

Local resident and event planner, Dina Thoma rallied our community to help her host the Stevens Family fund raiser Spaghetti Dinner and Raffle. Many area folks came to volunteer and support this couple whose home was hit and badly damaged by 2 cars last year. Funds are still coming in with plans being formed to help the Stevens family into a safer home on their property.

The Select Board is happy to support our local Clubs and Community fundraisers with no fee hall rental. Hartford residents can rent the hall for birthday parties, family events and other functions. Contact Lianne at the Town Office to see what dates are available.

Last fall, we finished up the phase 1 of the Pratt Hill project. The major goal was erosion prevention. This road work included culvert replacements in the road and many driveways down the hill. New ditching was done with water mitigation fabric and rip rap. More Pratt Hill Road improvements are planned in 2025.

The Town has submitted 3 grants over the last month. One for Records Scanning of old documents, one for energy improvements at the Town Hall and the third grant will purchase new office chairs and an anti-fatigue mat for our clerks working the counter.

We continue to look into ways to save money and keep our land owners taxes down. One area is increasing our recycling. The Solid Waste Committee has been working hard to share recycling information and resources. The more our residents recycle, the more savings we get. Savings from less tonnage of trash and recycling credits which reduce our overall tipping fees.

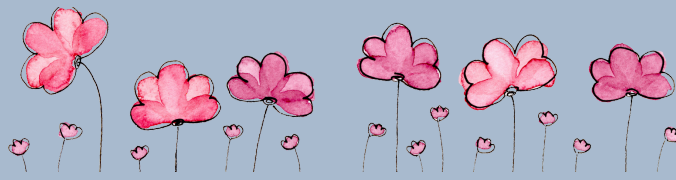

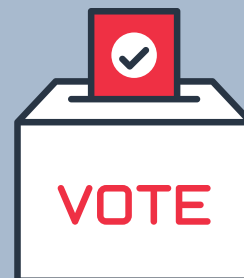

Storm Damage

The Town of Hartford has been working with FEMA since 2022 to address road damage caused by three extreme rainstorms.

We met with FEMA on 1/29/25 to close out some of the projects associated with disasters that occurred in 2022 and 2023 and to hand off the projects to MEMA (Maine Emergency Management Agency).

The funds we receive will reimburse the Town for emergency repair of many gravel roads, pay for administration costs, fund future permanent repair of the roads, and we will receive hazard mitigation funds to be used for preventative road work.

Who is supplying the funds?

Federal Share 75%, State Share 15%, Town Share 10%.

Assessing Information

April 1st of each year is the deadline to report changes to property ownership, buildings, including sheds and porches, and to apply for exemptions such as homestead exemption and veteran's exemption.

Tax bills are sent in October of each year and are due on December 1st and May 1st

The Tax Collector has between 8 months & 1 year from the date of tax commitment to record liens on unpaid taxes.

Once a lien has been recorded, it will automatically foreclose in 18 months from the date of recording if the taxes, interest, and lien fees remain unpaid.

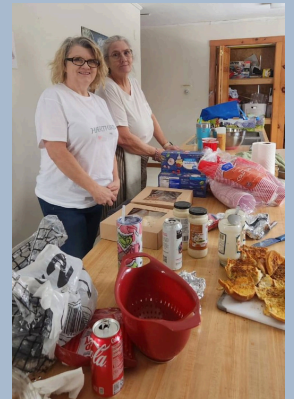

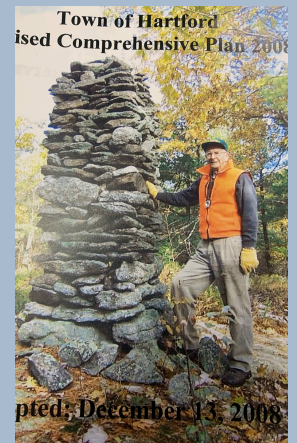

Pine Tree Plate

Maine will replace over 1,200,000 Chickadee plates between May 2025 and May 2026. It is important that Mainers who want to reserve their current plate numbers know they will be able to do so.

People with vanity, low digit and out of rotation plates.

Reserving your plate number guarantees to you that you will receive their plates two to four weeks prior to their registration's month of expiration at their address. If one does not reserve their plate number, you do lose it. If you wait to reserve at the time you re-register you will have to wait for the Pine Tree Plate to arrive at your residence, likely several weeks later. The reserve fee of \$25.00 will be required.

How does a customer reserve their plate?

Aside from what plate numbers must be reserved, it's important to know how we can reserve them. First is the standalone website that anyone can use. It is important to remember that this option is only available 30 days prior to a registration's month of expiration from May 2025 – June 2026.

Second is going through Rapid Renewal. We find most people choose this option, since they are prompted as they re-register.

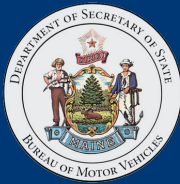
A third way to reserve is by walking in or making an appointment at a BMV branch, then going in and working directly with our staff. This option may be best for customers who aren't as familiar with, or do not have access to, the internet.

The fourth, and final way, one can reserve their plate number is by sending a filled out paper form to 29 State House Station, Augusta ME 04333-0029.

Please rinse and sort your recyclable materials as follows and place them at the curb for collection:

- Corrugated cardboard. Please flatten all boxes.
- Paperboard (cereal boxes etc.) Please flatten all boxes
- Glass bottles & jars: Please remove all caps & rings
- Newspapers/Magazines
- ONLY screw top plastic containers with recycle symbol/#2 (no oil containers)
- Steel/Tin cans
- Fluorescent light bulbs (unbroken) packed in boxes to prevent breakage

Weekly curbside trash bags must not exceed 70 pounds each.

NO REFUND FOR STICKERS

1. **White metal** such as refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners will only be accepted without charge if they have been “red tagged” to indicate that their Freon has been legally removed. If the Freon has not been removed a fee of \$15.00 must be paid at Town Office before the item may be picked up at curbside.

Refrigerators and freezers must have their doors removed before they may be picked up. Stickers will be provided to place on each item. Items without stickers will not be picked up.

2. **Copper and brass**
3. **Steel and iron**
4. **Aluminum**
5. **Untreated/unpainted wood IS NOT ALLOWED AT CURBSIDE AND WILL NOT BE COLLECTED**

6. **Painted and/or pressure treated wood. CUT INTO 4' LENGTHS**

7. **Furniture & Mattresses, limited amounts of construction debris and plastic materials.**

8. Tires: (Charges For Tires)

Tires must be removed from rims prior to disposal. A fee of **\$10.00** must be paid at the town office for **each tire** size 13”-20”. Tires over 20” will not be collected.

Stickers will be provided to place on each tire. Tires without stickers will not be picked up. Only 8 tires allowed per household.

9. Propane Tanks

Empty propane tanks will be picked up during the bulky household waste pickup at no cost if they have been punctured.

10. Universal Waste:

Examples of Universal Wastes: Computers, TVs, batteries (metal hydride, Ni-Cad, small sealed lead acid, lithium, mercuric and silver oxide button batteries), mercury switches and devices, PCB ballasts, which are usually, found in old fluorescent lighting fixtures.

Household Hazardous Wastes

These materials are not accepted at curbside nor may you put them out with your household waste for collection.

No out of town bulky items or trash allowed!

Residents may bring bulky items to Maine Waste to Energy in Auburn or Archies Inc. in Mexico (call to make an appointment). A fee will be charged to the resident.
